




Although the Welsh Lacrosse Association was formed in 1930, with objectives of furthering the best interests of the game, promoting and developing Welsh lacrosse and organizing international matches, Wales is still classed as a developing nation.

The first men's National team was formed in 1991 and has competed in both European and World Championships since. In 2003, Wales took its first development side to the World Under 19 Lacrosse Championships in Baltimore, Maryland. These players now form the core of the senior side and it is hoped that the Vancouver 2008 squad, which came eighth in the British national Championships, will go on to become part of the senior Wales squad for the 2010 World Championships in Manchester.

The 2003 Towson squad had a marked impact on lacrosse in Wales. From 1 men's team in 2001 Wales now has 6 clubs and all Welsh Universities have lacrosse teams. Pop lacrosse and junior development work takes place across South Wales, the standard is improving with the emphasis on developing homegrown talent and a support infrastructure.








